


In this 75<sup>th</sup> remembrance year of the discontinuance on April 27, 1938 of 4 towns: Dana, Enfield, Greenwich and Prescott for the creation of the Quabbin Reservoir, the Friends of Quabbin Reservoir have invited neighboring towns, which were spared discontinuance, to sponsor commemorative events. Because Shutesbury's pre-incorporation land grant name was Roadtown, it seemed fitting for our town's remembrance focus to be the effect of the Reservoir's creation on surrounding roads, specifically those running through the almost one third of our town now included in the watershed protection area.

On Saturdays, October 5 and 12, Leslie Bracebridge welcomes anyone interested in hiking some traces of Shutesbury roads that were discontinued to create the Quabbin Reservoir to accompany her on a walk down our "memory lanes."
