The state awarded \$2.1 million to Shutesbury, 60% of the project, on Thursday, also the Harry Porter Party Day! Congratulations to all those who worked so hard on the grant application. Well done! Fundraising work now begins in earnest. This is a project we can all benefit from and be a part of.

ED STUDY COMMITTEES from Leverett, Shutesbury, and Pelham met this week to further their discussion of a possible Outer Ring Region. Each town is coming to the table with many questions and many concerns. A profile of each community will show complicated funding, revenue sources with two communities having significant numbers of students "Choice-In" to their schools while Shutesbury does not accept "Choice" students. In Massachusetts revenue follows the child so there is concern that if the new Region did not accept Choice students it would have a negative revenue impact on the Region as a whole. Five-thousand dollars is paid by the sending town to the receiving town for every Choice student. Shutesbury officials shared their understanding that the Region could accommodate a mix of Choice and non-Choice schools.

All three committees separately voted to recommend that their Selectboard's support the creation of a Joint Regionalization Planning Committee to continue to explore the possibilities of a Small Town Region made up of Leverett, Pelham and Shutesbury.

BROADBAND This week MBI awarded grants for last mile efforts. Wired West received \$50,000. Leverett also received a planning grant for \$40,000. They are talking with Crocker Communication about stringing their own fiber optic cable, which the town would pay forfund itself, through a municipal bond. I have gotten inquires why Shutesbury is not doing the same thing. Why is Shutesbury just working with Wired West? The answer is the \$2 million build out price tag. Leverett has clearly expressed their appetite to use their bond rating to fund the project. Shutesbury has not.
