On Saturday, September 4, Selectboard members **April Stein**, **Elaine Puleo** and **Al Springer** (left to right) cut orange and yellow ribbons strung between the poles supporting four solar panels, amidst cheers of "solar power, solar power, solar power."

The celebration, which included displays, refreshments and sing-alongs to (You are my sunshine" and other solarthemed tunes played by **John Hayman** and **Alan Kurtz**, marked the completion of a project inspired with seed funding from CETA in 2004. One hundred residents of Shutesbury generously paid a premium on their electric bills for years. The Town became the beneficiary of that support for Green Energy. \$20,190 was received in Clean Energy Choice Grant funds last fall.

.. A second grant, EECBG funds for \$32,000, was pursued when the solar rebate program abruptly ended and left the town short on funds. Thanks to **Laura Sylvester** for her help with the grant. The grant was awarded. I asked the Energy Committee, "What to do now?" Their answer was, "Buy more panels!" The Selectboard agreed. With the addition of \$11,000 from the town's newly created Alternative Energy line, the town was able to double its original project from a 5 kWt system to a 10 kWt system.
