**2017 Special Town Meeting Warrant
Town of Shutesbury
Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

POSTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF MGL 30A §§18-25

To one of the Constables of the Town of Shutesbury in the County of Franklin,
Greetings:


In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to meet at **7:00** p.m. on Tuesday the **twenty-eighth** day of March, at the Shutesbury Elementary School at 23 West Pelham Road in said Shutesbury, in the year Two Thousand and Seventeen, then and there to act on the following articles:


Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to set the number of municipal light board members at five citizens of the town, pursuant to the provisions of the Massachusetts General Laws, of the five-member board, initially one shall be chosen for one year, two for two years, and two for three years, and thereafter the terms shall be for three years. The municipal light board shall have the authority to construct, purchase or lease the municipal light plant in accordance with the vote of the town and to maintain and operate the same.

(Sponsor: Selectboard and Broadband Committee) Requires majority vote

Hereof fail not, and make due return of this warrant, with your doings thereon, at the time and place of the meeting. Given under our hands this 28th day of March two thousand and seventeen.
