This may have been an issue of having too many of these night sky programs in quick succession, or an end of summer glitch.

Family Field Day: Mr. Carra is too busy to do field day in September, Sam isn't sure October is worth waiting on, when he is only a maybe. Library is doing Good Neighbor Day on Saturday, September 28 with music, maybe a food truck, craft activity for kids, pot luck desserts. Looking for set up, clean up, people to bring desserts, and for a financial contribution of \$100. This is part of a national endeavor. We could bring our own soccer equipment. We are all in favor.

Money to library for classes: \$1000 for activities and classes. All in favor.

Susie Mosher: town wide birthday party. Last year about 85 people came. About 250 invitations will be sent for decade birthdays, people over 80, babies born this year, and people new to town. Last year cupcakes and ice cream, beverages, someone brought pins they'd made to hand out. Planning to use the whole common this year. People want to bring hula hoops, maybe have a line dance, drumming. COA is donating \$100, the LOL have about \$100, they have asked the library

to cosponsor and are asking us. Sunday, Oct 6 from 3 to 5. All in favor of cosponsoring and donating \$100.

Soccer: Sean has not made it to the meeting. Sam would like it to happen. She will try to reach Sean. She hoping for an informal Sunday morning soccer get together for kids. She will try to organize it and invite the town families. Beginning September 29. Preschool to third grade perhaps. Sam will make a flyer and advertise.

Ideas for new year:

Bright Water Bog hike, part of a series of 4 seasonal walks Colleen Kelly would be good, BZ will ask her for a day in Oct or Nov.

Rocks of Shutesbury: good winter walk before it gets icy

Birding again in spring with Clif; maybe April Kite festival: maybe in May, Sam will arrange.
