POLE MOUNTED SOLAR PANELS BEHIND TOWN HALL 4 traffic barrels are aligned behind town hall at the positions each of the 4 poles will be placed. Each pole will have a rack of 12 panels on it and will be over 18' high. There will be 5' between each pole. It will be a 10 kilowatt system.
