COYOTE ALERT

There were 2 reports this week that are very worrisome on Pelham Hill Road. The first of a small dog that was snatched from it backyard while the owner was with it. The owner managed to free the dog but the dog was in poor condition and had to be taken to an emergency vet with multiple deep bites. The second incident was a jogger that found refuge from a driver in a passing vehicle when a large coyote held its ground on the road, intimidating the jogger. The change of season heightens the stakes between people and wild animals in our woods. I am arranging for a biologist to give a community talk about the creatures that we share the town with. Look for a date and time coming up. Please be protective of small children and do not let them wonder off.

STRETCH CODE FORUM October 20, 2010 at 7:30pm at the Town Hall The Stretch Code is included on the Special Town Meeting warrant for October 26 at 7pm. Adoption of the Stretch building code is the fifth criteria for the town to be classified as a "Green Community" and become eligible for a new pot of alternative energy grant money. This Stretch building code has many similarities to the new 2009 Building code that came into effect 7/1/10. "The purpose of 780 CMR 120.11 is to provide a more energy efficient alternative to the base energy code for new and existing buildings. A municipality seeking to ensure that construction within its boundaries is designed and built above the energy efficiency requirements of 780 CMR may mandate adherence to this appendix," from DOER Stretch Code Adoption process.

As of September 21, 2010, 47 Mass. Communities have adopted the Stretch code. The Stretch Code is a performance-based approach compared to a prescriptive based approach. Blow door test will be used to achieve a HERS (house energy rating system) score of 65 for a house greater than 3000 square feet and 70 for a house less than 3000 square feet. A 65 HERS rating means that the home will achieve 35% greater energy efficiency than a home built to the 2006 Building Code standards. Please come to the forum and learn more about
