NEW KNOT WEED BRIGADE

Robin did it again! Each week another pile of black bags shows up. Don't hesitate to join if you see her working away on Pelham Hill Rd. I have black bags available at town hall if you need them. The Lacy crew returning from vacation will be back at it this week. I am still bogged down at town hall so don't hesitate to get me inspired!

HIGHWAY PROJECTS Supt. Tim Hunting is working on finish work for the newly paved sections of West Pelham and Locks Pond Rd. On Locks Pond Rd. the crew has put down large amounts of rocks in the ditch banks for the water to flow through and lessen the drop off. On West Pelham Rd. there are driveways that no longer match up with the road that they are working on to smooth out.

An issue that keeps coming up in town is in regards to driveway culverts. If you live on a road that has water flowing through ditches along the edge of the road you may have a culvert at the end of your driveway. When a house is built that requires a new curb cut and driveway sometimes a culvert is built at the end of the driveway to allow the water coming down the road to pass under it. The culvert becomes a responsibility of the homeowner, not the town. Culverts need to be maintained to function properly. They get stuffed up with silt, leaves and sticks and need to be cleaned out. The town already has hundreds of larger culverts that run across and under the roads all over town. If you have questions about a pipe, i.e. culvert, on your property our highway superintendent can help answer them. Or call the town hall and I can get answers, clarifications from Tim. As every thing else, if the culverts are properly maintained they are less likely to become a bigger problem.
