To see if the Town will vote to take by eminent domain in accordance with Chapter 40, Section 8 C of the General Laws as amended by Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1965 for conservation purposes under the management and control of the Conservation Commission the following described parcel of land and water rights in Shutesbury:

Beginning at an iron pin on the East line of Lock's Pond Road, said iron pin being North 9° 57' 43" West 25.28 feet from an iron pin marking the angle point opposite bound #59 and running thence North 9° 57' 43" West 132.50 feet along said road to an iron pin; thence North 83° 38' East 248.6 feet along land formerly of Sumner Cole, to an iron pin at the end of the dam on said premises; thence Southwesterly along the margin of Lake Wyola to a point; thence North 68° 28' West about 16 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing North 68° 28' West 117.53 feet to the place of beginning, the last two courses being along land recently or about to be conveyed to Leon C. Billings, including all rights the owner or owners of said parcel may have in the land below the high water mark of said Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called, whether or not the same may be presently covered by the waters of said pond, including the dam on the premises and the right to maintain same and to conduct the waters of Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called, into the Saw Mill River, and including any rights that said owner may have to flow any land surrounding said Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called; and to raise and appropriate, borrow, transfer from available funds or otherwise provide any sum or sums of money therefore.

"I move that we take by eminent domain in accordance with Chapter 40, Section 8 C of the General Laws as amended by Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1965 for conservation purposes under the management and control of the Conservation Commission the following described parcel of land and water rights in Shutesbury:

Beginning at an iron pin on the East line of Lock's Pond Road, said iron pin being North 9° 57' 43" West 25.28 feet from an iron pin marking the angle point opposite bound #59 and running thence North 9° 57' 43" West 132.50 feet along said road to an iron pin; thence North 83° 38' East 248.6 feet along land formerly of Sumner Cole to an iron pin at the end of the dam on said premises; thence Southwesterly along the margin of Lake Wyola to a point; thence North 68° 28' West about 16 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing North 68° 28' West 117.53 feet to the place of beginning, the last two courses being along land recently or about to be conveyed to Leon C. Billings, including all rights the owner or owners of said parcel may have in the land below the high water mark of said Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called, whether or not the same may be presently covered by the waters of said pond, including the dam on the premises and the right to maintain same and to conduct the waters of Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called, into the Saw Mill River and including any rights that said owners may have to flow any land surrounding said Lock's Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called;

and that the sum of \$25,000.00 be appropriated therefore and to meet the appropriation the sum of \$16,000.00 be transferred from available funds and the sum of \$9,000.00 be raised by taxation." Voted unanimously, 48 yes, 0 no.

Beginning at an iron pin on the East line of Locks Pond Road, said iron pin being N 9° - 57' - 43" W 25.28 feet from an iron pin marking the angle point opposite bound #59 and running thence N 9° - 57' - 43" W 132.50 feet along said road to an iron pin; thence N 83° - 38' E 248.6 feet along land formerly of Sumner Cole, to an iron pin at end of the dam; thence Southwesterly along the margin of Lake Wyola to a point; thence N 68° - 28' W about 16 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing N 68° - 28' W 117.53 feet to the place of beginning, the last two courses being along land recently or about to be conveyed to Leon C. Billings, including all rights the owner or owners of said parcel may have in the land below the high-water mark of said Locks Pond or Lake Wyola, so-called, whether or not the same may be presently covered by the waters of said pond, including the dam on the premises and the right to maintain same and to conduct the water of Locks Pond or Lake Wyola so-called into the Saw Mill River, and including any rights that said owners may have to flow any land surrounding said Locks Pond or Lake Wyola so-called, including trees and structures situate thereon.

Being a part of the land conveyed to Locks Pond Reservoir Company by deed of G. N. Watson, et al, dated July 28, 1895, and recorded in Franklin County Registry of Deeds Book 437, Page 138.

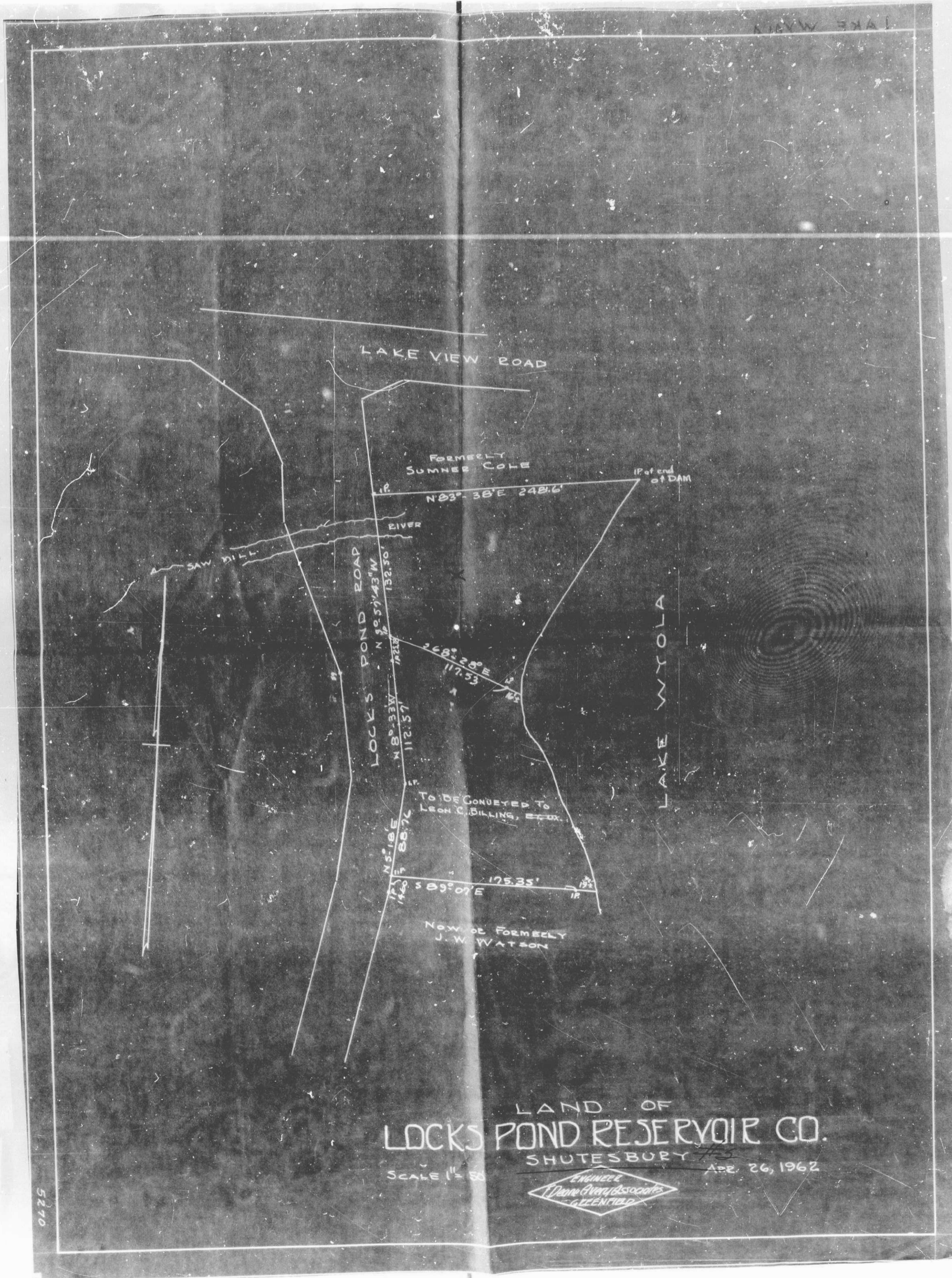

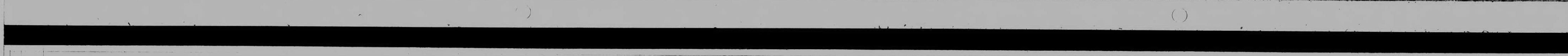
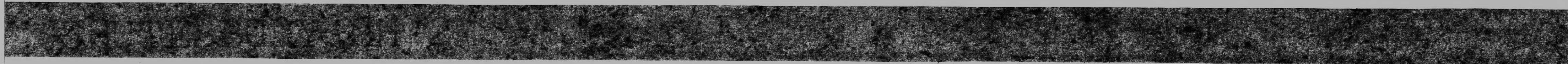

Dear Mr. Gullion:

Enclosed is a preliminary application on behalf of the Town of Shutesbury in connection with the acquisition of water rights at Lake Wyola.

In addition are the following supporting documents:

- (1) A certified copy signed by the Town Clerk indicating the acceptance of Chapter 40, Section 8C and the present members of the Conservation Commission with their appointment and expiration thereof.
- (2) A map showing the parcel of land to be acquired and which is marked with an "X".
- (3) Appraisals by Edwin W. Lawson of Orange, Massachusetts and Clarence Lamoureux of Easthampton, Massachusetts.

You will note from the preliminary application that the appraisals range from \$22,500 to \$25,000 and that the asking price is \$45,000. It is important that we know the final figure that will be approved by your Department, if indeed it is approved at all, so that I can gage my negotiation plans accordingly.

I know this project is familiar to you having been discussed on the telephone and at a conference in person. I am aware of Chapter 179 of the Acts of 1966 which permits borrowing without precluding self-help. I have, as yet, not seen a copy of the Act. I hope that we can combine borrowing under the new statute with what funds are in the Conservation Fund to accomplish our purpose. If you have an extra copy of the Act, I would appreciate it.


